THE F-D-A SAYS A COMMON DECONGESTANT, CALLED PHENYLEPHRINE, IS NOT EFFECTIVE WHEN TAKEN IN PILL OR LIQUID FORM TO TREAT NASAL CONGESTION.

INTERNAL MEDICINE DOCTOR CAROL NWELUE (UH-WAY-LUH-WAY) SAYS THE F-D-A FOUND THE MEDICATION IS SAFE ... BUT NOT ENOUGH OF THE DRUG CIRCULATES THROUGHOUT YOUR SYSTEM TO BE EFFECTIVE.

HOWEVER ... SHE SAYS THERE ARE OTHER USEFUL OVER-THE-COUNTER TREATMENTS.
